

I think this layout, story and graphic turned out very well, despite challenges.



I designed this layout the day before our deadline for Volume 8, Issue 3. The staffer who was assigned to it decided last minute that she did not feel like it. As the Editor-in-Chief, it is my responsibility to save any projects that fall through. In the end, I am very happy with how this layout turned out.

I created this layout for volume 8, issue 2 of Eagle Eye News about 12 hours before our deadline when our main feature had been scrapped and we needed a new cover. I absolutely love this layout because I feel it perfectly highlights the ingenuity of this issue. The student on the cover is meant to appear concerned about the drama surrounding the redrawing of the MSD boundaries, which are a result of the overcrowding. His silhouette is filled with photos from the overcrowded school and the boundary meeting, which juxtaposed each other through their cause-and-effect relationship. He wears an MSD needs Journalism hoodie and two Stars of David on his person, referring to our antiantisemitism feature story in this same issue. The photos that my staffers brought me were blurry, and with only hours left before the deadline, I found a way to play the hand I was dealt by taking inspiration from the cover of our issue about overcrowding from the previous year, creating the crowded hallway effect that I used in the background. I finished it off with a faded gradient of Viva Magenta, the recently released Pantone 2023 Color of the Year. 
