Kamala Harris Selects Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz as Running Mate

The National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA) has learned that Vice President Kamala Harris, the Democratic presidential candidate, has chosen Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz as her running mate after much speculation and a whirlwind of last-minute vetting and interviewing candidates.

As of Monday, August 4, reports suggested that Harris had narrowed her choices to Walz and Pennsylvania Gov. Josh Shapiro. Other considered candidates include Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg and Arizona Senator Mark Kelly.

Walz provides the ticket with a diverse and extensive background. His career spans over two decades in the Army National Guard, including deployment overseas after the 9/11 attacks and a dedicated period as an educator and coach. His political journey began with a surprising victory

over a six-term Republican incumbent in 2006, during a Democratic wave year. Walz maintained his seat in a typically red district until he ran for governor in 2018, after which the seat reverted to GOP control.

During his tenure as governor, Walz has faced significant challenges and navigating a series of political and social upheavals, including the COVID-19 pandemic and the murder of George Floyd, which sparked global anti-racist protests.

Despite criticisms and complaints, Walz's leadership led to a Democratic trifecta in Minnesota by early 2023.

Forbes Magazine highlighted Walz's appeal as a moderate Democrat with a working-class background and rural roots, making him an attractive option for independents and moderate Democrats. Former Senator Heidi Heitkamp praised Walz for his relatable life experiences, which align with many rural Americans.

Walz's political career began with a stint on former Massachusetts Senator John Kerry's 2004 presidential campaign. His transition from teaching on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota, where he met his wife, Gwen, to teaching in China and later at a high school in Mankato, Minnesota, set the stage for his political aspirations.

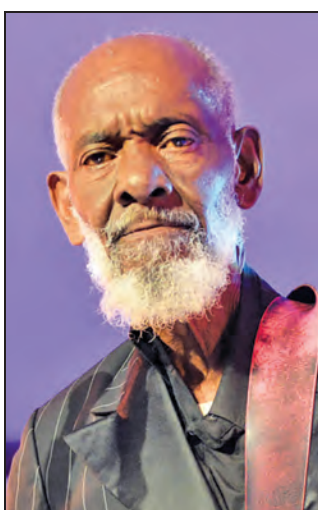

Fair Fight Held A Democracy Summit Around Voting Rights Act Anniversary

Last Wednesday, August 7, 2024 Fair Fight held a Democracy Summit to commemorate the 59th anniversary of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. Fair Fight will host the Fair Fight Democracy Summit: 59 Years After the Voting Rights Act. Speakers at the event highlighted the impact of anti-voter laws passed in Georgia and spotlight new issues that threaten free and fair elections, like the Georgia State Election Board's proposed rules changes that could be used to undermine the Peach State's 2024 election results.

Speakers also discussed why as Georgians and Americans across the country face an onslaught of new anti-voter laws, it's crucial the Voting Rights Act's protections are restored and strengthened even further. The federal standards in the Freedom to Vote Act and The John Lewis Voting Rights Act, had they passed,

Prior to the 1800's there was no such thing as public schools in America. The available primary school options were a hodgepodge of church, charity, private schools and tutors, with no educational standards or oversight, that often excluded girls, the disabled and children of color. But many of the Founding Fathers viewed education as the key to maintaining a democracy, believing that education empowered citizens to make smart voting choices, helped them to defend their rights and freedoms and empowered them to recognize tyrants and demagogues who would threaten the fragile democracy. The concept of publicly funded education began to blossom in the 1830's but wasn't fully realized and governed by Federal mandates until the 1960's. Project 2025's plan to eliminate the Department of Education threatens to dismantle public school as we know it while harming other aspects of education that you may not have known were under the Departments jurisdiction.

As a reminder, Project 2025 is a more than 900 page blueprint (www.project2025.org) created by the Heritage Foundation and dozens of members of the Trump administration, that outlines the fundamental changes that Trump and the Republican Party will make to the country should they return to power in January 2025.

According to the Department of Education section of Project 2025, "Federal education policy should be limited and, ultimately, the federal Department of Education should be eliminated." The mandate suggests that education be publicly funded but that school choice and standards be left to the States and families. The Mandate highlights, as an example of their plan in ac-

tion, the 2022 Arizona school voucher program that provided 90% of education funding directly to parents to use on school options of their choice. According to a Propublica investigation, as of July 2024, the State of Arizona was facing a \$1.4 billion deficit (<https://bit.ly/3ywqV0E>), largely due to the school voucher program, and has been forced to make cuts to vital public projects including infrastructure, highway expansion and funding to Arizona colleges and universities.

In addition to establishing standards for public school education, the Department of Education institutes policies on federal financial aid and distributes funds. They collect data and publish research on America's schools while prohibiting discrimination and ensuring equal access to education for all children. Project 2025 effectively eliminates the possibility of future student loan debt forgiveness stating, "Taxpayers should expect their investments in higher education to generate economic productivity. When the federal government lends money to individuals for post-secondary education, taxpayers should expect those borrowers to repay."

Elimination of the Department of Education leaves public schools vulnerable to the whims of individual States and the for-profit interests who want to tap into taxpayer dollars. This dismantling will eliminate research on equality in education while harming the futures of lower-income students who depend on federal financial aid to attend college. Elimination of the Department of Education could return the United States educational system to the pre-1800's where only wealthy White Males were guaranteed a quality education.

Kamala Harris Selects Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz as Running Mate

As governor, Walz's accomplishments include ensuring tuition-free meals at state universities, enshrining abortion rights into state law, banning conversion therapy, and protecting gender-affirming healthcare. Recently, he defended those measures against right-wing criticism, emphasizing the importance of accessible healthcare and education.

In May, Walz expanded voting rights in Minnesota for an estimated 55,000 formerly incarcerated residents.

While he has faced backlash from Minnesota Republicans over his stance on gender-affirming care, Walz has also been criticized for recent comments targeting political opponents.

Meanwhile, Harris' presidential campaign has continued to gain momentum, securing significant endorsements and unprecedented financial support. The National Association of Social Workers (NASW), the American Feder-

ation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), and the United Auto Workers (UAW) have all endorsed her candidacy.

Fueling Harris's campaign is a historic fundraising effort. More than \$310 million was raised in July alone, marking the largest single-month haul of the 2024 cycle. That brought her campaign's total fundraising to over \$1 billion, surpassing previous records and outpacing the Trump campaign.

As the Democratic National Convention approaches, Harris and Walz's campaign seeks to capitalize on the momentum. "We know the hard work required to secure a victory in November, and we are committed to seeing it through," Harris' campaign manager, Julie Chavez Rodriguez, declared after the record-breaking fundraising month. "When we fight together, we win."

Savannah Technical College Receives \$470,000 Nursing Grant



Savannah Technical College was awarded \$470,000 from the Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce (GBHCW) for its Practical Nursing program. The GBHCW recently provided grant funds to nursing schools in Georgia to increase the number of nursing graduates in Georgia's workforce.

"We appreciate the funding from the Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce, which enables us to support our Practical Nursing students," said STC President Dr. Ryan Foley.

Starting in Fall 2024, the Nursing Schools Grant will provide wraparound supports to improve STC Practical Nursing students' ability to persist and graduate with mental health counseling, emergency vehicle repair/transportation funds, books, supplies, uniforms, and loaner laptops. Students will also receive program-specific assistance through a combination of learning resources, assessment tools, and data analytics with ATI Complete Partnership, which will optimize student preparedness and better prepare graduates for success on the NCLEX.

The grant will also fund the purchase of a Pyxis Machine, which is a state-of-the-art automated medication dispensing system in healthcare facilities such as hospitals and pharmacies. It is designed to improve medication management, enhance patient safety, and streamline workflow for healthcare professionals.

Nurses are in high demand. In 2023, the Savannah metro area had a skills gap of 3,173 for registered nurses (RN), 1,611 for practical nurses (LPN), and 1,052 for nurse aides (CNA). Savannah Technical College provides training through competitive selection and with short-term training options including:

practical nurses, patient care technicians, and nurse aides. The College will soon will offer the Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN), which will allow those that complete it to take the registered nurse exam.

The GBHCW Nursing Schools Grant is designed to support nursing schools, providing more opportunities to enhance enrollment capacity and graduate more nurses to serve our communities.

A total of \$3 million in grants was awarded by the Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce. In addition to Savannah Technical College, Albany Technical College, Central Georgia Technical College, Georgia Southwestern State University, Lanier Technical College, and Southern Regional Technical College were also awarded grants.

Licensed practical nurses (LPNs), under the direction of physicians and registered nurses, care for people who are sick, injured, convalescent, or disabled. Program graduates receive a practical nursing diploma and have the qualifications of an entry-level practical nurse.

During her senior season, she led the team with 50 points on 23 goals and four assists. Quarterman was award-

Brown Receives Preseason Accolades

Savannah native and current Northern Illinois running back Antario Brown has received several preseason honors ahead of the 2024 football season.

In mid-June he garnered 2024 Preseason All Mid-American Conference teams by Athlon Sports and Phil Steele.

On July 19, he was named to the Preseason All-MAC First Team and on July 29 he was named to the Maxwell Award Watch List. The Maxwell Award, presented by

the Maxwell Football Club, is awarded annually to the outstanding player in college football.

In 2023 Brown became the first NIU running back to earn All-Mid-American Conference first team honors in eight years. Brown was second in the MAC with 1,296 yards and 6.11 yards per carry. He ranked in the top-20 in the Football Bowl Subdivision in rushing yards and yards per game. Brown had four games of 150 yards or more in 2023 with a 280-yard, four-touchdown effort in a 55-14 win at Akron. His 21.5 yards per rush against the Zips broke the NIU single-game yards per carry record set in 1989 by Stacey Robinson.

The Beach High School grad is the 13th running back in NIU football history to rush for over 2,500 career yards. He is fifth all-time at NIU in yards per carry at 6.33 and 10th with 78.8 rushing yards per game. Brown is one of two MAC players on the Maxwell Award watch list, joining Bowling Green running back Terion Stewart. A total of 80 players are on the 2024 Maxwell Award watch list.

2024 Olympics Wraps & Passes The Torch During Closing Ceremony

The 2024 Olympics closing ceremony held Sunday, August 11th in Paris was filled with so much excitement just as the opening ceremony was in Paris on Friday, July 26. The closing ceremony included the President of France and the International Olympic Committee president stepping out as the French National Anthem was sung as the host nation's flag was raised.

There was a parade of flags, a parade of athletes led by four-time Olympic swimmer Katie Ledecky and two-time Olympic rower Nick Mead. They were selected to lead the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team into the Closing Ceremony as flag bearers. Tom Cruise skydived in during the closing ceremony to take the Olympic flag from Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass and Simone Biles. As H.E.R. began to perform her music filled the air, Cruise then exited on a motorbike to deliver the flag to a sunny West

Coast which is the site for the Olympics in 2028. Some final medals were also given out during the closing ceremony. The 2024 Olympics closing ceremony was called "Records." Thomas Jolly, who was artistic director of the opening ceremony, also directed the closing ceremony.

The all-star lineup hit the stage as part of the handover to the 2028 Los Angeles Games. Each of the music artists was a California native. H.E.R. sang the U.S. National Anthem live from the Stade de France, while Billie Eilish and the Red Hot Chili Peppers performed in Los Angeles.

The next Summer Olympics will be held in Los Angeles from July 14-30, 2028.

At the end, the Olympic flame was extinguished.

Queen of 71! Reeves Wins Gold in Paris!

Olivia Reeves became the first American gold medalist in 24 years and posted an Olympic record (117 kg) in the snatch as she bested all competition in the women's 71 kg session at Paris 2024 on Friday morning. Reeves, 21, is the youngest American to claim Olympic gold in weightlifting since Ike Berger, 20, at Melbourne 1956. Lifting 117/145/262 and going 5-for-6, Reeves cleared the field by five kilograms as Colombia's Mari Sanchez and Ecuador's Dajomes Palacios finished with totals of 257 and 256, respectively. With the win, Reeves became the first American to earn gold since Tara Nott at Sydney 2000. The gold medal is the United States' 17th gold in Olympic weightlifting.

Reeves waited for the rest of the field to attempt their first snatch before loading the barbell with 112 kg and hitting her 10th opening snatch in a row. That opening weight matched her openers from the 2024 IWF World Cup and USAW National Championships as the heaviest she has ever attempted. Reeves then hit

115 kg on her second snatch. Reeves followed Romania's Loredana Toma's missed 117 kg attempt, an Olympic record, with her own go at the weight. Reeves successfully lifted that 117 kg to break the Olympic record, and she led Palacios by one kilogram after the snatch portion of the competition.

Reeves began the clean & jerk portion with a 140 kg opener, five kilos higher than any other opener in the session. The lift was Reeves' 14th consecutive successful clean & jerk opener, and allowed her next attempt to cement the gold medal. As she set her sights on reaching the Olympic record, Reeves cleared 145 kg to take a resounding lead. Reeves then attempted to match her personal best and secure an Olympic record of 150 kg, but came just short of completing the jerk, finishing the day with five successful lifts.

Team USA has now had a medalist in three straight Olympic Games, as Sarah Robles collected bronze at Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020, and Kate Nye earned a silver at Tokyo 2020.
