



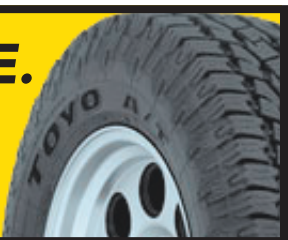

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Thousands greet Poilievre at Conservative rally in Breslau

CONSERVATIVE LEADER PIERRE POLLIEVRE POSITIONED himself as the next prime minister as he pushed for change during a campaign stop in Breslau last week.

“Kitchener-Waterloo, who is going to vote for change?” he asked while addressing some of the 5,000 people at the Region of Waterloo International

Airport on April 10.

The influx of people saw cars lined up on Fountain Street for two kilometres in both directions, causing some supporters to walk more than 15 minutes to get to the airport hanger.

Elmira’s Barry Martin attended the rally in support of Poilievre, saying he is “the only outlook for Canada.”

“We take him at his word, and the Liberals, you can’t take at their word. Carney’s bad,”

Martin said, as he doesn’t trust the party currently leading the country.

Another of those in attendance, Nathan, a 17-year-old high school student from Waterloo’s Laurel Heights Secondary School, never paid much attention to politics.

“I’m turning 18 this year, so I figured I’d get into it, and after doing my own research, I found that I was more on board with his ideas.”

His friend Kian, also at the rally, said he was on the fence between the Liberals and the Conservatives.

“I actually went to the Liberal rally a few weeks ago, and being at the Liberal rally, seeing everyone there being really old, to be honest, it made me realize that the next generation everyone wants to see the Conservatives win,” said the 18-year-old.

“We’re tired of the last Liberal decade, and I think it’s time for

a change, a real change with the Conservatives,” he added, as he thinks Poilievre has new fresh ideas he brings to light in his talks, whereas he thinks Carney is saying a few things over and over again.

Breslau’s Mike Ramsay also wants to see Poilievre as the next prime minister of Canada, saying, “We need someone to rescue our country, and he’s the one to do it.”
